RESOLUTION NO. 008- S2023

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE PROGRAMS PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES OF THE MUNICIPAL PEACE AND ORDER AND ANTI-DRUG ABUSE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SANTA CRUZ, LAGUNA FOR THE FY 2023 AMOUNTING TO TWO MILLION SEVENTY TWO THOUSAND PESOS (PHP2,072,000.00) PESOS SUBJECT TO ALL LEGAL RULES, LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, on October 14, 2022 the Municipal Mayor Hon. Edgar S. San Luis endorsing a letter for the passage and approval of a resolution of the Municipal Peace and Order Council based on Peace and Order Public Safety Plan (POPSPLAN) FY2023 in the amount of Php2,072,000.00 of the Municipality of Santa Cruz, Laguna;

WHEREAS, every Province, City and Municipal POC and Barangay POC shall formulate a 3-year term program/plan based on Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan (POPSPLAN);

WHEREAS, the main goal of Peace and Order and Public Safety Plan is to strengthen the partnership and collaboration with the stakeholders of the Municipality by strengthening the organizational development of PNP, BFP, MDRRM and improved the community awareness through community oriented and human rights based policing; to lower the crime rate in the community by reducing/eliminating human rights violation and make the Municipality of Santa Cruz, Laguna a prohibited free and safest place in the fourth district being the capital town of Laguna and by eliminating terrorism and providing support to the constituents, investors and visitors;

WHEREAS, perusal of the submitted plan reveals that the Municipal Peace and Order and Anti Drug Abuse Council aimed to enhance the capabilities of the law enforcers by implementing programs and activities that will develop the skills, promote innovative solutions by using modern technologies and encourage peoples participation in building a safe and drug free Santa Cruz, to wit;
